


Make your own Chatterbox!

Follow the steps below to make your own Chatterbox and test your friends on how much they know about the wildlife at Blackbutt Reserve.



Step 1. Cut along the dotted line to make a square.



Step 2. Fold the square diagonally from number 4 to number 1 and diagonally again from number 3 to number 2 so that the animals are on the inside.

Step 3. Open up the paper and flip the page so that the animals are face down with Kevin the Koala and his instructions are face up. The page should be square again.




Step 4. Fold each corner along the white line so they meet at the centre of the square, there should now be a smaller square.



Step 5. Turn the paper over and repeat Step 4 with the smaller square by folding each corner into the centre.



Step 6. Now fold your paper in half, the numbers should be on the outside and the animal names should be on the inside, and you're ready to test your friends!

How to Play

Once you have made your chatterbox you're all set to play!

Step 1. Ask your friend to pick one of the numbers on the top of the chatterbox.

Step 2. Based on the number they have chosen you will have to open and close the chatterbox as you count to their chosen number. **For example** – If your friends have chosen '3', you would open and close the chatterbox 3 times, one for each number as you count to 3.

Step 3. Next, ask them to select an animal from the options in the open chatterbox, open and close the chatterbox for each letter as you spell out the animal's name. **For example** – if they say 'Koala', you would open and close the chatterbox 5 times, one for each letter.

Step 4. Your friend will then select another animal from the options in the open chatterbox, lift up the corner and ask them the question to see just how well they know the animals at Blackbutt Reserve!
